


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### STEP 1 PLACE YOUR CHESS BOARD

Place your board on your table so that a black square is on the left side of each person playing.



### STEP 2 PLACE THE KING PIECES


This tower isn't

Begin by placing your white King piece. He belongs in the fifth square to the right on the back line.

Just remember, white King goes in the black square.

The black King piece should be placed directly across the board from the white King.

The King piece has the cross on top.



## DID YOU KNOW...

You cannot win a game of chess with only a King piece.

But you can draw!

## STEP 3 PLACE THE QUEEN PIECES

Place the white Queen piece on the left side of the white King piece. It should be four squares from the left side of the board.

Place the black Queen piece directly across from the other Queen piece.

Remember! White Queen = white square, black Queen = black square.

The Queen has a crown.



## STEP 4 PLACE THE BISHOP PIECES

Place one bishop piece on each side of the King and Queen pieces for both black and white.


The Bishop has a tall, skinny hat with a notch in the top of it.



## STEP 5 PLACE THE KNIGHT PIECES

Place one Knight piece next to each Bishop piece for both black and white.

The Knight often looks like a horse.

### DID YOU KNOW...

The Knight is the only piece that can jump over other pieces on the board.



## STEP 6 PLACE THE ROOK PIECES

Place a Rook piece on each corner of the board.

The Rook looks like a small castle.





## STEP 7 PLACE THE PAWN PIECES

Place one Pawn piece in front of each piece already on the board.

The Pawn is the smallest piece and has a round head. Each side has 8.

# PLAY CHESS!

(WHITE MOVES FIRST)

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Pawns cannot move backward. When the king is attacked by another piece this is called "check". Knights are also the only pieces that can move over other pieces. If you lose the king, you lose the game. Crazyhouse: This is a very exciting format since it allows you to use the pieces you take from your opponent. King Of The Hill: In this format, the goal is to get your king to the center of the board or "top of the hill." Bughouse: This format is played in pairs. Using one or two pieces to attack will not work against any decent opponent. We must only write down our moves and our opponent's moves correctly. The second row (or rank) is filled with pawns. Castling is done just like in standard chess, with the King and Rook landing on their normal castled squares (g1 and f1, or c1 and d1). Control The Center Of The Chessboard You should try and control the center of the board with your pieces and pawns. Notice how the white queen captures the black queen and then the black king is forced to move. The goal of the game is to checkmate the other king. Set up the pieces at the beginning of the game will be really easy. But the queen is the most powerful chess piece. However, finding the right PC gaming controller can take your games to the next level for an experience you'll enjoy over and over. The player with the white pieces always moves first. This move allows you to do two important things all in one move: get your king to safety (hopefully), and get your rook out of the corner and into the game. That is, if I play as White and I take a black pawn from my opponent, that pawn will turn into a white pawn that I can put on the board as part of my army. That is NOT true. Practice By Playing Lots Of Games The most important thing you can do to get better at chess is to play lots of chess! It doesn't matter if you play at home with friends or family, or play online, you have to play the game a lot to improve. We hope they're useful to you! How Do I Get Better At Chess? Everyone loses - even world champions. How To Promote A Pawn In Chess Pawns have another special ability and that is that if a pawn reaches the other side of the board it can become any other chess piece (called promotion) excluding a king (or pawn, for that matter). They were created to make the game more fun and interesting. How To Castle In Chess One other special chess rule is called castling. I can do so in any of my future turns. The game is declared a draw by stalemate. The players may simply agree to a draw and stop playing There are not enough pieces on the board to force a checkmate (example: a king and a bishop vs. Which Color Starts In Chess? If there is another piece directly in front of a pawn he cannot move past or capture that piece. The king may never move himself into check (where he could be captured). However, in order to castle, the following conditions must be met: it must be that king's very first move it must be that rook's very first move there cannot be any pieces between the king and rook to move the king may not be in check or pass through check Notice that when you castle one direction the king is closer to the side of the board. Pawns keep their normal initial position but the rest of the pieces are arranged randomly. A common misconception is that pawns may only be exchanged for a piece that has been captured. N3. If you control the center, you will have more room to move your pieces and will make it harder for your opponent to find good squares for his pieces. And, like with all pieces, if the queen captures an opponent's piece her move is over. You should usually castle as quickly as possible. However, they can be moved to take the place of an opponent's piece which is then captured. Thanks to it, we can register the whole game in writing and reproduce it as many times as we want. Regardless of which side, the king always moves only two squares when castling. There are so many different types of PC game controllers that it can be tough to find the right one. Bishops work well together because they cover up each other's weaknesses. A pawn may be promoted to a knight, bishop, rook, or queen. Then it moves just like that piece and can move backward. 3-Check: In this format, the first player who checks the opponent's king three times, wins. How to Move the King in Chess The king is the most important piece, but is one of the weakest. Customarily the king is not captured or removed from the board, the game is simply declared over. Being able to move first is a tiny advantage that gives the white player an opportunity to attack right away. The origins of chess are not exactly clear, though most believe it evolved from earlier chess-like games played in India almost two thousand years ago. Clocks and Timers - Most tournaments use timers to regulate the time spent on each game, not on each move. Find Out Who Makes The First Move In Chess The player with the white pieces always moves first. Pieces cannot move through other pieces (though the knight can jump over other pieces), and can never move onto a square with one of their own pieces. Use All Of Your Chess Pieces In the example above white got all of his pieces in the game! Your pieces don't do any good when they are sitting back on the first row. e4. That is called castling "kingside". How To Move The Rook In Chess The rook may move as far as it wants, but only forward, backward, and to the sides. The rooks are particularly powerful pieces when they are protecting each other and working together! How To Move The Bishop In Chess The bishop may move as far as it wants, but only diagonally. There is an easy system that most players use to keep track of the relative value of each chess piece. How To Move The Knight In Chess Knights move in a very different way from the other pieces - going two squares in one direction, and then one more move at a 90-degree angle, just like the shape of an "L". On a player's turn he may move his king two squares over to one side and then move the rook from that side's corner to right next to the king on the opposite side. Remember, it doesn't matter how close you are to checkmating your opponent if your own king is checkmated first! Don't Give Pieces Away Don't carelessly lose your pieces! Each piece is valuable and you can't win a game without pieces to checkmate. These days it's easy to find a game of chess online! How To Play Chess Variants While most people play standard chess rules, some people like to play chess with changes to the rules. How To Setup The Chessboard At the beginning of the game the chessboard is laid out so that each player has the white (or light) color square in the bottom right-hand side. How To Do "En Passant" In Chess The last rule about pawns is called "en passant," which is French for "in passing". If a pawn moves out two squares on its first move, and by doing so lands to the side of an opponent's pawn (effectively jumping past the other pawn's ability to capture it), that other pawn has the option of capturing the first pawn as it passes by. Only pawns may be promoted. Pawns can only move forward one square at a time, except for their very first move where they can move forward two squares. e4 or 1. They can never move or capture backward. Once a player makes a move they then touch a button or hit a lever to start the opponent's clock. For example: If I play as White and my teammate, who is Black, takes a white knight from her opponent, in my turn I will have a knight that I can put on any free square on my board. Step 1. You should learn from each game - those you win and those you lose. Some other players prefer 1. When one player captures a piece from the opponent, this piece will become available to his or her teammate. Each variant has its own rules: Chess960: In Chess960 (Fischer Random), the initial position of the pieces is set at random. Checkmate happens when the king is in a position to be captured (in check) and cannot escape from capture. If a player runs out of time and the opponent calls the time, then the player who ran out of time loses the game (unless the opponent does not have enough pieces to checkmate, in which case it is a draw). How To Draw A Chess Game Occasionally chess games do not end with a winner, but with a draw. a king) A player declares a draw if the same exact position is repeated three times (though not necessarily three times in a row) Fifty consecutive moves have been played where neither player has moved a pawn or captured a piece Step 6. If a king cannot escape checkmate then the game is over: d4 or 1. The rooks go in the corners, then the knights next to them, followed by the bishops, and finally the queen, who always goes on her own matching color (white queen on white, black queen on black), and the king on the remaining square. White then makes a move, followed by black, then white again, then black, and so on until the end of the game. A pawn is usually promoted to a queen. Step 4. How To Checkmate In Chess The purpose of the game is to checkmate the opponent's king. There are only three ways a king can get out of check: move out of the way (though he cannot castle!) block the check with another piece or capture the piece threatening the king. A pawn is worth 1 A knight is worth 3 A bishop is worth 3 A rook is worth 5 A queen is worth 9 The king is infinitely valuable At the end of the game, these points don't mean anything—it is simply a system you can use to make decisions while playing, helping you know when to capture, exchange, or make other moves. Pieces are generally moved into positions where they can capture other pieces (by landing on their square and then replacing them), defend their own pieces in case of capture, or control important squares in the game. She can move in any one straight direction - forward, backward, sideways, or diagonally - as far as possible as long as she does not move through any of her own pieces. However, when a pawn gets to the other side of the board you must promote it to another piece (such as a queen). Can A Pawn Move Backwards? These are called "chess variants". Knowing the rules and basic strategies is only the beginning - there is so much to learn in chess that you can never learn it all in a lifetime! To improve you need to do three things: Play lots of chess - just keep playing! Play as much as possible. Don't put off castling. The game of chess we know today has been around since the 15th century where it became popular in Europe. The king can only move one square in any direction - up, down, to the sides, and diagonally. Each player has 16 pieces: 1 king, 1 queen, 2 rooks, 2 bishops, 2 knights, and 8 pawns. Try and develop all of your pieces so that you have more to use when you attack the king. That is why we put at your disposal these frequent questions that usually occur in those people who are beginning to enter the world of chess. Have fun — Don't get discouraged if you don't win all of your games right away. You can only move one chess piece at a time when it is your turn to move - with one exception! When you castle, you move both the king and the rook in one move. Most other moves are not as good. This happens when the king is put into check and cannot get out of check. This usually results in most players playing one of their central pawns (in front of king or queen) forward two squares with either 1. This special move must be done immediately after the first pawn has moved past, otherwise the option to capture it is no longer available. Castling to the other side, through where the queen sat, is called castling "queenside". If a player touches an opponent's piece, they must capture that piece. Notation was invented so that we could analyze chess games after playing them. Each player gets the same amount of time to use for their entire game and can decide how to spend that time. There are 5 reasons why a chess game may end in a draw: The position reaches a stalemate where it is one player's turn to move, but his king is NOT in check and yet he does not have another legal move: With the move Qc7, black is not threatened and can't move. Checkmate can happen in the early stages of the game if one of the players does not act carefully. These rules do not necessarily apply to play at home or online, but you may want to practice with them anyway. A player who wishes to touch a piece only to adjust it on the board must first announce the intention, usually by saying "adjust". Therefore, players generally decide who will get to be white by chance or luck such as flipping a coin or having one player guess the color of the hidden pawn in the other player's hand.
